RED MOUNTAIN ORIGINALS

In 1975 our family planted the first vineyard on Red Mountain, an area now known for producing some of the world's most powerful, opulent wines of distinction. For three generations we've worked together on our farm to grow exciting, vineyard-driven wines that capture the essence of our Red Mountain estates.

$VINEYARD\ PROFILE$

The Kiona Estate vineyard is the oldest on Red Mountain. We have 4 distinct blocks of Merlot here; the first was planted in 1976, the youngest in 1995. All four feature in this release. Recently we've seen a dramatic increase in demand for Red Mountain Merlot, owing in part to the quality of these more established blocks and the elegant, layered wines they produce.

$WINE\ PROFILE$

Merlot from Red Mountain is special; here it's a powerful yet elegant grape, capable of producing wines of profound depth and density of character. Our oak regimen emphasizes geographical specifity and variety purity - neutral barrels outnumber new. Cabernet Sauvignon, Petit Verdot, and Malbec components provide layering, depth, and additional complexity.

WINEMAKING //

Kiona Estate Merlot component 100% hand-picked into macrobins on 9/21/21. Mechanically and optically sorted into 1.5 ton open-top stainless fermenters. Innoculated with Saccharomyces ceravisiae D21. Combination of twice-daily manual punchdowns and punchovers. 100% ML. 26 months in 43% new French, 1.3% new American, 1.3% European, remainder neutral.

VINTAGE NOTES //

2021 saw some of the warmest temperatures on record in our area, particularly early in the growing season. Heat units in May and June tracked 11.8% and 10.5% higher than in 2020, respectively, while the second half of the summer (July-September) was cumulative- ly 12.2% lower. Quality across the board is high, with many growers on Red Mountain noting the surprisingly nice acidities given the powerful ripening season. Yields were lower than expected.
