A KIONA VINEYARD

For the first 25+ years of Kiona Vineyard's existence, grape sales to other winemakers represented a small part of overall company revenues. However, that changed with the 2006 addition of our Heart of the Hill estate vineyard, Kiona's largest and most ambitious site. The new acreage allowed the business to expand our tonnage and acreage contracts with other top wineries in the Pacific Northwest, culminating in the current era with over 60 grape-sourcing agreements in place.

Planted in approximately 20-acre increments from 2006 to 2014, Heart of the Hill's distinctive tetromino shape and ubiquitous consideration as one of the top sites on Red Mountain has left an indelible mark on the region. Cabernet Sauvignon dominates, although smaller plantings of complementary cultivars (including but not limited to Carmenère, Petit Verdot, and Malbec) allow for intra-vineyard blending for site-designated products.

Heart of the Hill is uniquely representative of the Red Mountain region as a whole, given its size and centralized orientation within AVA. A private water system co-owned with Ste. Michele Wine Estates delivers reliable, Yakima River-sourced water.
